Volunteer Opportunities

Ignatian Volunteers

Ignatian Volunteers are men & women age 50 and over who are willing to share their skills, talents and life experiences with organizations that directly serve the poor or marginalized.

Volunteers work two days every week for a service agency. Local agencies include: Lighthouse, UDM Institute for Leadership & Service, SS Peter & Paul Warming Center, Loyola High School, Reggie McKenzie Foundation, Crossroads, Capuchin Youth Program, Detroit Cristo Rey High School, Children's Hospital, All Saints Neighborhood Center and Stephen Ministries.

During monthly meetings, volunteers pray and reflect on their experiences. They also meet every month with a spiritual reflector and attend an overnight retreat.

Warming Center at Ss. Peter & Paul Jesuit Church

HOSPITALITY: We provide a welcoming safe haven for our guests complete with refreshments. Each day we offer a hot meal and sandwiches. We also have a television, newspapers and magazines. We have a quiet room for those who need a place to rest.

HYGIENE: Shower and shaving facilities along with restrooms are available for our guests to take care of their individual needs. Our laundry room provides the opportunity to wash clothing and other belongings.

PRACTICAL CARE: We provide free use of a phone and mail service. When available, we distribute new socks, underwear, hand-warmers, hats, gloves and scarves.

LEGAL ASSISTANCE: Volunteer attorneys are available to assist guests with identification, social security, disability and other matters on Wednesdays, during the Winter season.

MEDICAL AID: Medical students from Wayne State University visit our guests when available to provide basic screenings and services.
